AND THE WORD *Became Flesh*

Christmas fills us with so many emotions. Christmas carols evoke memories of Christmas past. The creche and the scenes of the manger touch our heart. At this time of year we are filled with renewed hope and expectation. Perhaps things will be different this year. Perhaps there will truly be peace on earth. Christmas fills us with so much hope and expectation because it is a mystery beyond our comprehension.

The mystery is this: the Word became flesh. The eternal Word of God became flesh. In the Christ child, lying helplessly in the manger, God entered our world. And because God has entered our world, we can no longer say, “God does not know what it means to suffer. God does not know what it means to be poor. God does not know what I feel and experience.” The Word became flesh, and so God knows our joys and sorrows, our hopes and disappointments because in Christ Jesus the Word became flesh.

Because Christmas is a mystery beyond our understanding, the church presents us with four different Gospels at Christmas, each Gospel shedding its particular light on the mystery of Christmas. On Christmas Eve, we hear the genealogy of Jesus that roots Jesus Christ in the history of his people, Israel. Jesus is the royal Messiah, the

son of Abraham, the son of David, the Son of God. Born of the Virgin Mary, he is the culmination and climax of his people’s history. Read Matthew 1:1-15.

At the Mass at Midnight, we read the traditional Christmas story of Jesus’s birth in Bethlehem. Because there was no room for the family in the inn, Jesus is born in a manger and wrapped in swaddling clothes. The first to learn of his birth are not kings and nobles but shepherds watching over their flocks. It is to them that the angel proclaims “Today, in the city of David, a savior has been born for you who is Christ the Lord.” Read Luke 2:1-14.

The Gospel for the Mass on Christmas day at dawn is also taken from the Gospel of Luke. It is the continuation of the Gospel at Midnight and narrates how the shepherds visited the child in the manger. Read Luke 2:15-20.

The Gospel for the Mass on Christmas Day is the highlight of the Christmas Gospels. Taken from the opening chapter of Saint John’s Gospel, it proclaims the great mystery of the incarnation, the mystery of the Word made flesh. Read John 1:1-18.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ... And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.

In these verses we find the full mystery of Christmas: the Word was God and the Word became flesh and dwelt among us. Who could ever fathom the depth of this mystery? God has entered our lives in Jesus Christ. To see Jesus is to see God incarnate. To hear Jesus is to hear the Word of God. God dwells among us and our lives are forever changed. Nothing can ever be the same. All is new, all has been transformed. Merry Christmas!

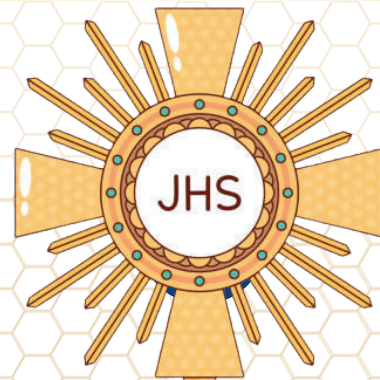

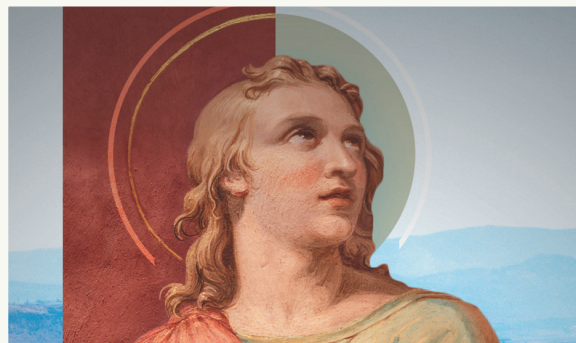

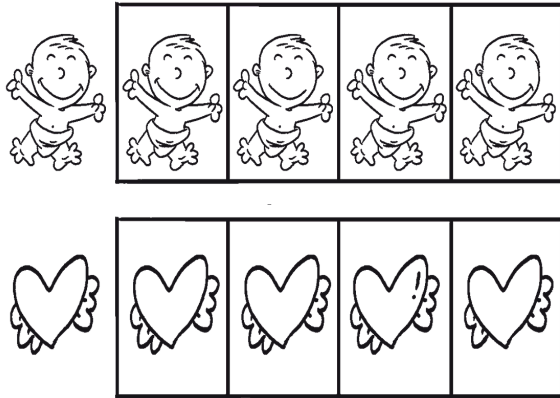
