


SUNDAY OF THE *Word of God*

In 2019, Pope Francis designated the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time (this year, January 25) as “Sunday of the Word of God,” a day devoted to the celebration, the study, and the dissemination of the Word of God. To be sure, the Word of God plays a central role in our lives every day not just one day a year. But it is helpful to designate a particular day each year on which we are reminded of the role that God’s Word plays in our life of discipleship.

Every Sunday we are fed at two tables: (1) the Table of the Word and (2) the Table of the Eucharist. While we understand the importance of being fed at the table of the Eucharist, we may forget that we are also fed at the Table of God’s Word through the scriptures we hear every week. In the first reading, which is usually taken from the Old Testament, we hear the Word that God spoke to Israel long ago and now speaks to us in Jesus Christ. In the Responsorial Psalm we respond to God’s Word in God’s own words. In the second reading, taken from the writings of the Apostles, we hear the witness of the apostolic church to Jesus. Finally, in the Gospel we hear the very words of Jesus, the Son of God. Every week, then, we are privileged to hear the Living Word of God in

which God reveals his will and plan for our salvation.

The Epistle to the Hebrews teaches us that God’s Word is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword. It cuts to the quick and reveals God’s will for us. But it is not easy to grasp the full depth of God’s Word in a single hearing, and so we must constantly ask ourselves: How should I live the Word so that it will transform my life? How should I receive the Word so that it will transform my life in the way that the Eucharist transforms my life?

But if the Word is to change and transform our lives, we must become intimate and familiar with it, just as we are familiar and intimate with a good friend. For this to happen, we must read the Word every day, year in and year out. For it is only when we become familiar with the Word that the Word reveals her secrets to us.

So what can we do this year to become more familiar with God’s Word? Here are two suggestions. First, set aside time every day to read and pray over the Scriptures. Read the text slowly. Be silent. Let the Word speak to you. Listen to what the Word says to your heart. Second, develop a program for reading Scripture. For example, read through the Four Gospels, one each month. When you have finished, read through the Book of Psalms, five psalms each day. When you are finished, begin all over again! Pray as you read, be silent, and the Word will nourish and transform you.




